Q1 Budget Report - Operational Expenses

• Finish line operations - races have been very good about paying in advance so we are slightly ahead in projected income

Balance Sheet

February Budget showed a surplus (for the year) of \$4690. Within that context, the following Budget Proposals are up for review:

Wet Bulb Globe RRCA Coaching Reimbursement 10x10 Custom Canopy

Budget Proposals

Wet Bulb

- As a result of RD training and RRCA Conventions Harriet has sat in on she has become concerned about extreme heat for our signature races, particularly Summer Solstice 8k
- Wet Bulb Globe Thermometer measures ambient temperature, relative humidity, wind and solar energy to determine a WGBT index.
- Multiple sources uses recommend the WBGT is used by many local races,
 Frederick Half, Corrigan Sports for Baltimore Marathon, Rockville Rotary Twilight
 8k and American College of Sports Medicine
- Recommend the Kestral 5400, it is significantly less complicated than some of the other instruments to use (~\$479)
- RRCA recommends the use of a WBGT thermometer to its subordinate organizations
 - Pam feels we can use WeatherBug and other readily available applications and we will be able derive the same information. She believes it is more important for us to educate our members about making an educated decision than it is to rely on a WBGT
 - Javier feels there will be arguments in both directions, both for and against the WBGT. He feels it is an appropriate risk mitigation device and should be considered especially when our races and events are open to the public. Additionally he feels because it is a recommendation of our parent organization it is important to consider

MOTION: Harriet Langlois makes motion that club approves the Wet Bulb Thermometer Budget Proposal

- RRCA Coaching Certification

 - Current Coach for WDF 5k

- 10x10 Custom Canopy
 - The club has used the same pop tent for years. Harriet and Lou have previously looked into ordering a tent and having Grimes screen print it, however it was not feasible
 - Received price quotes from three separate online canopy retailers.
 - Eumax (sold thru Amazon cost ≅\$1298.00 with screen printing)
 - Ecanopy (sold thru eCanopy.com = \$1999.00 with screen printing)
 - Promotional Design Group (sold thru their website)

 Prices range from \$1500 - \$2500 depending upon the frame weight and durability

MOTION: Harriet makes motion that club approves the Custom 10x10 Canopy Budget Proposal by Promotional Design Group (Rhino Max Silver, plus 6ft table cover, and one feather banner) with a total expenditure not to exceed \$2200.00

Race Revenue Proposals

- Rick's Run Revenue Proposal Updates
 - FSRC Memorial Scholarship Committee decided to give more money to the scholarship recipients, rather than fund an endowment
 - Committee decided to forego endowment and disperse maximum funds available to this year's recipients

MOTION: Lou King makes motion that club approves the Rick's Run Race Revenue Proposal as amended prior to the meeting for the 2016 race

Pam Geernaert seconds the motion

Motion vote: Lou, Harriet, Javier, Brent, Pam Mark and Sage in favor MOTION APPROVED

- Market Street Mile Race Revenue Proposal Updates
 - LES Capital Improvement Fund is excess money from other funding raised from the track at Lincoln Elementary School
 - The Community Foundation charges a fee for to manage any remaining money monthly, thus it was decided to move the funds to the Steeplechasers
 - Anne sat down with the PE teacher, Principal, and others from LES to discuss the items PRC uses that belong to the school
 - Brent, Harriet, Lou, and Mark are recommending we transfer the LES Capital Improvement Fund to the Rotary Club of Carroll Creek
 - Rework proposal, MSM Funds would be used for operating expenses, the proposed equipment and excess would be put towards the building of the shed
 - ACTION: Anne will contact Rotary Club of Carroll Creek to see how to transfer LES Capital Improvement funds there
 - Lou decided to table proposal as it needs to be reworked with expectation funds are transferred to RCCC

Event Revenue Policy

 With Larry Key Memorial Trail Run was not strictly a race, thus we had to revisit the Race Revenue Policy and now we are proposing an additional policy to be known as FSRC Event Revenue Policy

MOTION: Lou King makes motion that club approves the Event Revenue Policy as amended from the Race Revenue Policy

Motion vote: Lou, Harriet, Javier, Brent, Pam Mark and Sage in favor MOTION APPROVED

Suggestion Box

- Alyssa Vance Race Day Childcare Officers worry this is an insurance issue.
 Recommend that parents seeking such arrangements should get together among themselves to find a sitter, releasing the club from liability
- Karen S Suggests we make a the Steeplechasers a Closed Group so her "friends" can't see what she posts
 - Recommend she change her settings on FB so she can control who can see what she posts. In any case, club is not planning to close the FB group.

Mission Statement Update

- Our mission statement is out of date, we would like to update it as we have grown so much since the last mission statement was drafted

- ACTION: Lou to post on Facebook, soliciting recommendations for mission statement

RRCA Convention Debrief - Harriet

- Race Cancellation Root Cause 76% Weather, 11% govt. Shutdown, 9% lack of registrations, @ 5 civil unrest
 - Decision 55% RD, 25% municipality, 20% mutual
 - Every race should have a plan for various scenarios and should be prepared to handle public relations fallout
- Citywide Running Programs
 - Atlanta Track Club and Memphis Runners have an over-reaching message to develop brand, mission, core values and protect them
- Preparing Medically for Endurance Events
 - We need to think about a club/race medical director to attend our signature races and advise us on creating and implementing incident action plans

 Race Guards, First Aid/CPR trained volunteers who run races at various paces and become another set of eyes in the event of an emergency

Governance - Finances

- Every club needs an Internal Controls Document (in process)
- Each time a Treasurer leaves post an audit should be done
- Keep a budget and track against it
- Recommend criminal background check

Governance Bylaws

- Check list for the bylaws received from meeting, will be used to draft new set of bylaws
- o ACTION: Lou to draft new bylaws after updated mission statement is agreed to

Increasing Diversity

- Lou notes we do not have much ethnic diversity in Frederick and our club demographics do not match that in Frederick County
- Suggest you run through ethnic neighborhoods (advertise locally)
- MLK day runs
- Advertise in Community Centers in Ethnic Neighborhoods
- Harriet plans on reaching out to different running groups for the WDF and inviting them along to participate (Black Girls Run)

Officer Nomination Process Kickoff

- Terms are up for current officers in January 2017
- Exec Board assembles 3-5 person Nominating Committee
- Nominations come from committee, board members, membership
- Slate communicated to membership head of annual meeting
- Vote on slate is held at annual meeting, and can call nominations from the floor
- Mark Lawrence has agreed to chair Nominating Committee

General Membership Meeting

• Recommend we reserve October 19th for General Membership, back-up date is October 20th

ACTION: Javier to check with the Delaplaine about availability for General Membership Meeting

Race Services

- FSRC Vests for FRF Course Marshals place our brand on the vests and hand them out to volunteers and just ask to have them drop them back at the tent or drop at ITSF after the race
- We accept the risk that we may lose some but we will budget for it

Premium Promotion

- FSRC sells affordable premium promotion to local races for \$75
- Distribution list is about 9300
- Propose a blackout dates for any races that conflict with our signature races
- Pam suggests we could use some foresight and brainstorm some ideas about races we
 may decide we do not want to promote in the future

General consensus determined that it is ok to blackout some important dates, regardless
of policy draft

ACTION: Pam is going to draft up a policy on some items that we will use to consider for not supporting some future races (i.e. poorly managed, disruptive to community, etc.)

Pie Run

- Secured a port a potty location on private property adjacent to race start/finish.
- Going to use bibs with pull tags to support growing race
- Proposed online registration to smooth race day registration
 - Mark is worried online registration is going to have the race outgrow the venue
 - We can always cap the # of registrants (at this point Mark does not want to explore that option)
 - Raise the fee for non-members to \$10 (have them pay the processing fee, about \$2)
- General consensus determined that online registration will be set up for Pie Run and Lewis Run

Competition Committee

 For Summer 2017 we will be establishing a new 5k race series, it will include 6-7 local races (Frederick, Howard, and Washington County). Scored like the equalizer series. Must run 4 of 7 to qualify. Five overall winners M/F (Recommend Deer Dash, Krumpe, Waynesboro Firecracker)

Women's Distance Festival

- Background: WDF committee would like to support some women in need directly, in addition to the funds donated to the Women's Giving Circle. Looking at the organizations supported by WGC grant funds, we approached Gale House, a local substance abuse residential halfway house.
- 9 women from Gale House would like to take the 5k training. We'd like to provide free FSRC memberships so that they can take the training. Gale House will pay for participant race fees and FSRC membership for any staff/volunteers who join the 5k training.
- General consensus determined that the club will provide the indicated Gale House memberships for free, rather than from WDF race proceeds

Newsletter

Julie Harris presented an idea to create a space on the newsletter for friends of the Steeplechasers.

ACTION: Julie will create a communication to provide to our "friends" to standardize the info we receive from them to put on the newsletter.
